

SARAH LAWSON RESEARCH SCHOLARSHIPS DEADLINE FOR APPLICATIONS FEBRUARY 10, 2014

The Biology Department administers the **SARAH LAWSON** scholarship fund to support 4-5 Biology students to **conduct BOTANICAL** research during the summer. The scholarships are valued at **approximately \$1,500/month** and can be held for a **minimum of 3 and maximum of 4 months**.

ELIGIBILITY:

1. You must have **completed your 2nd. year of study** and be a **Biology or Marine Biology Major or Honours student with an academic record suitable for honours and graduate study (B/B+ G.P.A. in your Biology classes)**. The scholarship is primarily intended for Biology honours students who will be able to use the **summer research toward their honours thesis**. The scholarship is not intended to provide summer employment for students who have very high academic records but are planning on entering professional schools, such as Medicine, Law, Pharmacy, etc. upon completion of their undergraduate degree.
2. Your research **project must be in BOTANY**. The project must be well designed and supervised and should lead to **new knowledge about any “type” of plants, algae or fungi**. Projects which only superficially impact on a botanical subject, such as the feeding habits of animals which are eating plants, are not appropriate for Sarah Lawson support.
