Honours Research and Thesis

3 members of the honours committee each year.

This class is required of, and restricted to, all Biology and Marine Biology Honours programmes in which Biology or Marine Biology is the major area of study. Students conduct a research project supervised by a research scientist and attend meetings of the class once or twice a week for both the fall and winter terms. The class grade is based on the evaluation by 3 scientists of the honours thesis which is submitted in April, an oral presentation about the research to the class, and an oral or poster presentation at the Honours Cameron Conference in February. Co-op students attend this class by registering for Biology or Marine Biology 4901 and 4902. Participation in the class and the Cameron Conference are also the basis for determining the Pass/Fail status of the Honours 21st credit (also called the Honours Qualifying Exam).
